The Bible makes confident claims that God can heal people.

And yet, we regularly pray for people who are unwell, and nothing seems to happen. This sort of paradox can give us what psychologists call cognitive dissonance: that unpleasant feeling when we believe mutually incompatible things.

People naturally want to reduce this discomfort. One way to do this is to oversimplify and ignore one side and push into the other: 'God always heals if we pray,' or, 'there's no point praying for healing.'

Another strategy is to avoid praying. Either way, our prayerful connection to God suffers.

But just as our friends don't always communicate as we expect (or want!), God always responds to prayers for healing, but it might not look like what we expect.

God will restore all things, but not necessarily now.

Healing is not the same as curing.

God might reply in a very different way, including reminding us that praying for a cure isn't always the right thing to do.

But our prayers are always heard.

An ex-patient from St Georges Hospital, London, where I had trained as a nurse, had a bridal shop, and willingly helped me to choose my wedding dress from her display. An aunt made the Bridesmaids' dresses for my sister and cousin, two more aunts lent the Bridesmaids capes to keep out the cold on their way to the church, while a number of people in the church made sure all was in order for the wedding. Robin chose my cousin Graham, who he had known for a long time, as Best Man.

In leaving home in the car with my father, I reflected on the number of people who had helped to make this a special day; one to remember, that the promises made would be for a lifetime.

It was a happy day, with many relatives and friends attending the wedding, including a number of friends who had trained with me at St George's. The service was taken by Rev David Luce. The Church organist was Leon Young, who was a talented musician. He arranged and played the accompaniment to the popular, 'Stranger on the Shore'.

The reception was at the same place as my parents had theirs in Tonbridge in January 1940 during World War Two. It brought back happy memories for them as well.

Married life initially started in London for a short time, before moving to Northamptonshire. Church

membership was transferred to the Baptist Church where Graham's father was minister.


Robin and Margaret have received a card from King Charles and Queen Camilla which they received in good time for their big day. They have kindly shared this with us.
