I'm supposed to be in training for an Ultra walking event (50km) in April so am on the lookout to combine ministry with walking. This is not difficult for someone committed to pilgrimage as an expression of discipleship and mission. The Wrekin was on the route to my preaching appointment in Bayston Hill so I walked up it beforehand - and recorded a video for the District merger at the top!

If we say "where are the missing generations on a Sunday morning?" one answer is "up the Wrekin". I struggled to find a parking space before 8.30am on a day when the cloud hung low. Many of my fellow walkers seemed in their late 20's or early 30's (which someone at the top told me was because the Wrekin is big on Instagram). Listening to the snatches of conversation around me I heard talk of health and fitness - but also of relationships, emigration, mortgages and careers. I wondered what it might be like to offer as the Wrekin chaplain?! The Halfway House cafe has recently been reopened by the Yellow Ribbon UK - a Christian charity working with ex-offenders and people with complex needs which sounds like a smart missional move. The Samaritans poster at the bottom also caught my eye and reminded me of the mental health crisis - particularly amongst the young - and its links with physical health and the beauty of creation.

On to Bayston Hill - a church holding many memories with people I've grown to know well. We held much in prayer - particularly the fragile ceasefire just 2 hours old - and the inauguration tomorrow.

I was treated to lunch and a beautiful bouquet - it felt like it was a little early for what some have dubbed "the farewell tour"! But I was deeply touched

Scam Alert

Do you remember on 21st November last year, I shared in the Circuit Newsletter that a lady called Iris had lost her husband and wanted to donate her piano to someone?

Well it was a scam. Going forward we will only share items for sale or that someone wants to donate, if we can be sure that the person is someone known to us as a Circuit.

Please read the email below.

I don't live in your area, but I have just come across your newsletter from last November online while checking out an email we had received about someone offering a free piano. Unfortunately this is a scam. There is no piano and anyone taken in by it is likely to end up paying money to movers that don't exist.

I was doing a reverse image search on the photo we received of the piano, and Google showed me your recent newsletter. The photo used is the same one sent to us from someone named "Flora" and the wording on the email we received is almost identical to your message shared in the newsletter. My mother received it when it was circulated round a group she is a member of, so I think the scammers are hoping that by getting trusted groups to share the "advert" this will lend it an air of authenticity.



I would hate for any of your parishioners to be taken in by this, as we nearly were.

Both Richard and I believed the offer to be true, but we need to be sure when sharing things with you that you aren't going to be scammed, but you need to keep yourselves safe too.

If you see an offer that might seem to good to be true, please try doing a reserve image if they provide a photo.

To do this go to google.co.uk. At the right hand end of the search bar is a symbol that looks a bit like a camera (next to the microphone symbol). If you click that, it allows you to upload an image that you have, and it will then search for pictures similar to that image (rather than searching by keywords). If there are exact matches of the picture, they should appear higher up the results. I think it's called Google Lens.

If you're not sure then please forward the image onto me and I'll do it for you.

It doesn't take very long and could save you from being scammed.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2025 – Do you believe this?

Deepening connection on the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea is at the heart of resources for 18 to 25 January 2025.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2025 - Do you believe this?

As we celebrate 1,700 years since the Council of Nicaea, the worship for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (WPCU) has at its heart, the Nicene Creed. Reflecting this, the scripture readings for this year focus on belief.

We are invited to reflect on the story of Martha's confession of faith in Jesus as narrated in John 11:17-27. Each of us is called to sit with Jesus' provocative question to Martha: "Do you believe this?"

Churches Together in Britain and Ireland General Secretary, Dr Nicola Brady, says in her introduction to this year's resources: "Read in isolation the question might appear as a stark challenge, but from the Gospel story it is clear that the words of Jesus are spoken in love and experienced as invitation as well as challenge. Similarly, while the Council of Nicaea was not without its challenges as a wounded and scattered church sought to discern the truth of the Gospel message, there was an obvious desire to deepen connection and belonging and to live faithfully as disciples of Christ."

The WPCU service has been prepared by the community of Bose, an ecumenical monastery of brothers and sisters in Northern Italy.

The Biblical texts for each of the eight days highlight key statements of the Nicene Creed.

- Day 1: The fatherhood and motherhood of God who rules the universe.
- Day 2: Creation as God's work.
- Day 3: The Incarnation of the Son.
- Day 4: The Paschal Mystery: Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus.
- Day 5: The Holy Spirit, breath of God.
- Day 6: The Church: Community of believers.
- Day 7: Baptism into the Death and Resurrection of the Lord.
- Day 8: Waiting for the Kingdom.

CTBI also provides Go and Do points for each day of WPCU to turn reflections into action.

What is the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity?

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (WPCU) takes place each year from 18 to 25 January. It is an international ecumenical celebration.

Each January individuals pray, and churches and ecumenical organisations celebrate the WPCU in a variety of ways. These include events large and small, a simple prayer meeting, an ecumenical breakfast, a prayer walk, speaker events, online prayer relays, preaching swaps in villages and towns, using social media to share online reflections and prayers from church leaders as well as joint services bringing together Christians from across the traditions in prayer and worship.

Oakengates Bible Reflections Group meet for two series of 5-6 weekly sessions each year. One of these is in Lent and the other in the autumn.



Andy has recently moved to become the Vicar of Madeley in Telford. He is married to Sandra and has a 19 year old called Jacob who helps at FS.






