The Methodist Church apology in relation to Mother and Baby Homes and forced adoptions

Part of the mission of the Methodist Church in the 20th century was to work with single mothers who did not have others to support them. The aim of the Church (which no longer runs any homes) was to offer compassion and care. But we are deeply saddened and ashamed that some mothers who lived in these Homes, and some children who started their lives there, have shared with us that they experienced poor or abusive care and were denied control and decision making over their own lives. For decades these institutions operated under our oversight, and many vulnerable individuals, we have been told, were subjected to harsh conditions, neglect and abuse. We deeply regret any pain and trauma which may have been caused by our actions and the systemic failures that allowed such injustice to occur.

We are grateful that women who spent time in some of the Homes have been willing to step forward and share their experiences with us. We hope that this might encourage more women to come forward so we can offer ongoing support.

We recognise the profound impact these experiences have had on survivors and their families and we are committed to supporting the healing process and ensuring that such injustices are never repeated.

To those who were affected, we offer our sincerest apologies.

#### John Fletcher of Madeley Primary School Update from Julie Tomlinson, Methodist School Worker

Since Christmas I have been working in school on Mondays and occasional Fridays and continue my ministry to the SEND hub children through music and song. They all look forward to that as do I, as it is extremely rewarding. The children are non-verbal but respond in different ways to the music. Last Monday we rocked along to 'We have a King who rides a donkey' and 'Our God is a great Big God' which went down well. It's also good to encourage and support the dedicated staff who do so much for the children.

Weekly visits to Reception class have gone well this last term and we have been learning about Jesus and being kind to one another. We thought about Lent and how Jesus faced hard challenges in the desert, but He never gave up.

In the other classes we have made 'Lent Bags' with the children. This has been quite an endeavour. We made 75 bags with yr 3 and 4 in one session! The discussions arising from these sessions have been incredible and the children asked some very interesting and thoughtful questions. The bags are designed to help with prayer and focussing through Lent and the children get to take them home. In each bag certain items are placed to enable private thought and prayer.

The small STONE represents the stones Jesus was tempted to turn into bread. We hold the stone in our hand and remember how He said bread was not as important as the Word of God.

The TEARDROP is when we feel sad about something or someone and we can look at it and pray about this. God is always listening.

The ROSE PETAL helps us remember Mary the mother of Jesus and give thanks for all people who show us love as a mother would.

The COMPOST and SEED: As we plant the seed, we ask that God would grow the seed of Faith in our own hearts.

The WOODEN CROSS: As we hold the cross, we thank Jesus for dying for us and rising again

and giving us a way to God.

Each child is given a paper bag to decorate, and we had some beautiful designs. I would ask you to pray that God speaks to these children in their quiet moments at home.

On Friday 4<sup>th</sup> April the Prayer Garden was dedicated ( Jo Kudlacik was able to attend ) and we had an Easter service at St Michaels.



STAY n PRAY continues and is now a regular event on Monday lunchtimes as are the Bible meditations at Breaktimes. There is a good number of children attending and we are following the church year. Learning what it is to be a disciple has been our theme. Each week we make our crafts, chat, and sing and sometimes pray. The opportunity for prayer is always offered. I (or Mrs S my helper) usually read from the Bible as the children are colouring or crafting. The Yr 6 group of children (5) have grown in faith and commitment and are now thinking about moving on to their respective secondary schools. They would all love me to go with them!! so my prayer is that there is a Christian presence for these children who so appreciate an oasis in their week. Wouldn't it be wonderful to have a Christian support worker in every school!!

Health wise, my leg continues to play up and it can be too painful to drive. These polymyalgia flare ups are annoying! Please remember me and all the children and staff at J F in your prayers. Its such a privilege to share Gods love with them. Thank you for your interest and Happy Easter to all!
